# Here's our ultimate winter checklist

1 Ski for FREE at Treetops Resort during our annual Ski Free Weekend, held December 11-13, 2020. Choose from a variety of lodging options throughout Gaylord and let them know you'd like to Ski Free! Visiting later in the season? 3 Check in with winter wildlife at <u>Aspen Park</u>. Thanks to the white background, photographing the elk and scenic pond is never better. Take Otsego Avenue south to Commerce Boulevard's end. 989-732-4060

4 Rent a snowmobile from Boathouse Marine & Powersports and check out some of the 500 miles of groomed trails branching throughout northern Michigan from our central location. 989-448-2014, <a href="https://www.snowmobilegaylord.com">www.snowmobilegaylord.com</a>

5 Nab a pass for some tubing excitement at Treetops Resort or the Otsego Resort. 888-TREETOPS or 989-732-5181.

6 Shout "Woo-woo-woo!" all the way to Mackinaw City as you snowmobile the former North Central Michigan Railroad Corridor. 62 miles of snowmobiling bliss! 231-348-8280

8 Get to the trails...cross country or snowshoe style! Whether a beginner or expert, you'll find miles of trails to suit your taste. Boasting over 152 inches of annual snowfall and heavily wooded, rolling terrain, the Gaylord area offers some of the most enjoyable and challenging cross country skiing and snowshoeing in Michigan. 9 Are you an angler that can't get enough? Cut a hole in the hard stuff and start a great Gaylord winter tradition — drop a line and do some ice fishing on one of the 90+ lakes in Otsego County! #### The Snowman Cam

Snow junkies can scope out the fluffy stuff in Gaylord 24 hours a day on <a href="www.snowmancam.com">www.snowmancam.com</a>, a live feed from a snowbelt backyard that shows the snow as it falls. The weatherman is a snowman. The measurement tools are a dial thermometer and a decorative snow ruler, and you can donate dollars to feed the wildlife that pass into the frame. Regular visitors include black bear, deer, porcupines, raccoons, wild turkey, squirrels, birds and more.
